NAPA COUNTY WATER QUALITY: IT'S A MATTER OF TASTE

June 26, 2019

The invited Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) Executive Officer's Response to the Grand Jury report on "Napa County Water Quality: It's a Matter of Taste" is as follows:

Recommendation 7: The LAFCO Municipal Service Review of drinking water and wastewater countywide resources recommendations are due in February 2020. Each Napa County municipality's senior municipal elected officials should review, evaluate, respond to, and where appropriate, incorporate the LAFCO MSR recommendations into each Napa County municipality's operating and long-range plans. Each of Napa County's senior municipal elected officials should implement these actions by no later than June 30, 2020.

LAFCO Executive Officer's Response: The respondent appreciates, and agrees with, the recommendation. The LAFCO MSR is on schedule to be completed in February 2020. Any recommendations contained in the MSR will be more likely to be acted upon if they are reviewed, evaluated, and responded to by each Napa County municipality as recommended by the Grand Jury.
