STANDING ORDER OF THE NAPA COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT

ORDER RE: EXTENSION OF RESTRAINING/PROTECTIVE ORDERS

Effective April 8, 2020, in accord with Emergency rule 8 of The Amendments to the California Rules of Court, Adopted by the Judicial Council on April 6, 2020, and upon consideration by and with the approval of the Judges of the Napa County Superior Court, it is hereby ORDERED that:

- 1. All criminal protective orders that are set to expire during the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic are hereby ordered automatically extended for a period of 90 days from the set expiration date, or until the matter can be heard, whichever occurs first; and
- 2. All restraining orders or protective orders after hearing that are set to expire during the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic are hereby ordered automatically extended for up to 90 days from the set expiration date to ensure protected parties are able to seek a renewal of their restraining/protective orders, if needed.
